New!! Changes to the ASFA Rules and the Constitution - effective August 1st



LCI – Lure Courser Excellent title

The LCI title “Lure Courser Senior” has changed to “Lure Courser Excellent” in all three LCI Stakes (Small, Large, and Sighthound Mix). Those dogs that have earned the title of LCS will keep that title. Any points earned toward the LCS title will transfer to the Lure Courser Excellent (LCE) title as of August 1, 2024. This change makes it clear that the title acknowledges an advanced level of competition, rather than the advanced age of the competitor. Membership forms – recognize the “Club Liaison”

Membership forms have been updated to reflect a change in language from “club delegate” to “club liaison”. The change is to differentiate between a club contact person (club liaison) and an ACoD Delegate, as they do not need to be the same person. *Club Membership Forms* <https://www.asfa.org/membership.htm>

ASFA Running Rules and Constitution

Changes in the ASFA Running Rules and Constitution were approved at the 2024 ACoD and through the Rules Evaluation Committee process. These changes went into effect on August 1st and are posted on the website.

Membership Committee Report

WELCOME TO OUR NEW CLUBS. We have had two clubs apply to the ASFA. Both clubs held their Fun Trials and have been approved as Fast Track Affiliate clubs. Please welcome **ORCA**, Oklahoma Racing and Coursing Association, to Region 4 and **LEGS**, Lure Enthusiasts of Georgia Sighthounds, to Region 7. Please support these clubs as they take the next step to becoming member clubs.

New!! **CLUB LIAISONS.** At the ACoD in March, a CRC (Constitutional Rules Committee) proposal passed that changes all references from a “club delegate” to a “club liaison”. There has always been confusion regarding the difference between a club delegate and an ACoD delegate and whether a club’s ACoD delegate needs to be the club delegate (they do not). Changing the nomenclature will help remove this confusion. The new terms distinguish a “club liaison”, a “convention delegate”, and a “regional meeting delegate”. This change went into effect on the 1st of August. I know it will take some time for us to get used to the new terminology as well as learn to spell liaison without having to think twice! *Note: The changes occur primarily in Article IV of the ASFA Constitution, but additional references occur in Articles II, V, VI, VII, IX, X, XI, and in the Appendix.*

New!! **NEW RULE ON PAYING DUES ON TIME.** Also, at the ACoD a proposal passed which requires club dues to be current in order to schedule or hold an ASFA trial. The new rule is as follows:

Membership dues shall be payable on or before the first day of May of each year and shall be accepted only when accompanied by a list of names and addresses of the current officers of the club, and of the club delegate. No member club may vote, schedule, or hold an ASFA trial whose dues are not paid for the current year. No later than ~~April~~ February of each year, the Membership Committee shall send each member club a statement of its dues for the ensuing year.
ASFA Running Rules, Article II - Membership, Section 2 – Dues

In other words, if your club has not paid its dues by the May 1st deadline your club will not be able to schedule or hold an ASFA trial. Most clubs are very good at getting their renewal dues and update form to me well ahead of the deadline and I greatly appreciate it.

I welcome any suggestions you might have to make it easier for you to renew. We have an online option, which is very easy to use.

OUR CURRENT CLUB STATUS. On a sad and disappointing note, we lost the following clubs this year, including LARK, BCOSW, GIT, TSA, JRRWA. and LSBC. We have 65 clubs that renewed for 2024.

THANK YOU to all the clubs that consistently send in their renewals early. You are greatly appreciated, and special thanks to the hard-working membership committee members: Russ Jacobs, Jayme Jones, Cindy Antonik and Pat Spinazzola.

Results from the Survey on the ASFA and AKC Lure Coursing Programs.

The ASFA Board wishes to thank everyone who participated in the recent survey on the ASFA and AKC lure coursing programs. We received approximately 250 responses and found some common themes in your responses. Here is what we asked and what you told us:

The Survey

1. What do you like about the ASFA Lure Coursing program?
2. What do you like about the AKC Lure Coursing program?
3. Do you favor ASFA providing educational support to AKC's lure coursing program, such as judges' education, licensing, and lure coursing seminars?
4. What are the potential advantages of combining the two programs?
5. Do you have any additional comments or opinions to share?

Summary of Responses to Question No. 1

What do you like about the ASFA Lure Coursing program?

- LCI Program: 32% of those who responded like the LCI program and the opportunity it provides to non-sighthounds and sighthound mixes. There are a few who complained about the LCI program but the vast majority favored the program.
- The ability of non-AKC breeds to participate as well as the ability of unaltered mixes to participate: The next most often topic raised was that non-AKC breeds, such as Silken Windhounds, can participate in lure coursing trials and compete for titles, points and rankings etc. Additionally, there were positive comments about mixed breeds competing without having to be spayed or neutered, and that cryptorchid dogs may also compete.

- **ASFA's Structure:** The third most often item favored is the 100 point system weighted for speed and agility, with stakes being split at 10 hounds, and that the titles reflect levels of excellence, including Veteran titles and Singles titles.
- The atmosphere at ASFA events was also a positive point for many, i.e. inclusivity, less “dog show” politics, relaxed atmosphere, sense of community, better behavior, friendliness, and fun.
- The fact that ASFA has regionals and regional directors, as well as the ACoD (with the annual awards), were positives which allow the fancy to participate and provide input. The “bottom up” structure is seen as more inclusive where exhibitors can make motions regarding rule changes etc., rather than people in a boardroom who may not even lure course.
- The ability to have ASFA trials in Canada was also a plus.
- Others like the Communiqué, the ability to get points from BIF, points and placements over qualified dogs to eliminate pulling dogs after prelims, and that field championships are more aligned with a dog's ability verses how many dogs show up that day. In addition, ASFA is an all volunteer organization, it's easier to schedule events, and you don't need majors for a championship.

Summary of Responses to Question No. 2

What do you like about the AKC Lure Coursing program?

Of the 247 responses to the survey, 65 did not respond to this question. Those who did respond liked the titles, the number of events, breed recognition, breed disqualifications and neutering. A smaller number of responses indicated they liked the point system, Fast Cats, and records keeping. Many included both positive and negative comments about AKC. When it comes to judging, there were mixed reviews about judging at AKC trials. Some pointed out that AKC is not really a lure coursing program with directors, but rather a record keeping organization that gives a select few AKC registered clubs control over events and trials. Also, some stated that AKC lure coursing is simply part of a Performance Dogs Sports Events program governed by the AKC Event Operations Department. 7.7% of the responses voiced negatives about the AKC program.

Summary of Responses to Question No. 3

Do you favor ASFA providing educational support to AKC's lure coursing program, such as judge's education, licensing and lure coursing seminars?

There were 151 responses which favored ASFA's involvement in providing educational support for several reasons, including:

- (1) ASFA's judges education is superior,
- (2) ASFA's rules are preferred,

- (3) ASFA is over 50 years old and has a rich history in the sport, and is better suited to provide education, training and seminars,

- (4) Shared educational opportunities are a good thing,
- (5) It will help grow the sport, and
- (6) AKC looks down on mixed breeds.

Additional comments voiced their preference of this support, provided there was one program in which ASFA maintained its identity, some felt AKC should contract with ASFA and pay for such services, that AKC should recognize non-AKC breeds such as Silken Windhounds, and that AKC no longer require mixed breeds to be spayed or neutered.

There were 19 responses that did not favor providing support because it was stated that AKC should train their own judges, there are difficulties in accessing ASFA event schedules, there is no reason to do so, and that in ASFA if you don't judge for two years you lose your license. This person felt it should be extended to five years. Lastly a few felt ASFA should stay separate from AKC.

Other comments varied that neither favored nor opposed the idea. A comprehensive response noted that positives would be judges education and providing better training for judges to ensure consistent and fair evaluations of hounds across lure coursing events. Also having a robust licensing program that certifies judges meet the necessary criteria and knowledge requirements to properly officiate would be of great benefit, along with offering webinars and in person seminars and clinics.

It was noted that AKC focuses on record keeping, which is a detriment to the sport. Also, it was noted that AKC should accept ASFA titles and that ASFA should handle the lure coursing program. Some simply preferred AKC. Some would prefer that both programs continue to exist separately. Some felt AKC judges should be grandfathered in as ASFA judges because ASFA makes the judges licensing criteria too hard.

Summary of Responses to Question No. 4

What are the potential advantages of combining the two programs?

Positives as well as concerns were expressed regarding the idea of merging the two programs.

Positives: Increasing the pool of coursing judges, clubs and events; higher attendance at trials and more knowledgeable people running trials; less competition for time and people, you wouldn't have to choose one over the other; less politics; better judges; better training for judges; easier to get rankings (you would not have to work to get rankings in both organizations); your hound can become a field champion in fewer runs; there would be one national event; a stronger coursing community in which volunteers and the fancy are consolidated; growth in the sport; one set of rules, paperwork and one judging system; and the benefit of ASFA's vast experience.

Concerns: How to ensure that Silken Windhounds and other non-AKC breeds be able to participate and compete; how to ensure the LCI program continues; how to ensure ASFA would not lose its identity; what about dogs being able to compete with breed disqualifications; how to maintain titles for the Singles stake; some see no advantage to a merger.

Summary of Responses to Question No. 5

Do you have any additional comments or opinions to share?

Many who responded want to ensure that the favored attributes of the ASFA program are maintained and continued, in the event of any merger of the two programs. The fancy would like Silken Windhounds and other non-AKC breeds and non-AKC registered breeds to continue to compete. People like the LCI program, and that ASFA allows intact mixed breeds to participate. Concerns were expressed about what happens to AKC judges who are not already licensed ASFA judges – would they be grandfathered in? Many would like their existing ASFA titles recognized. Canadians want to keep participating. People prefer the ASFA Singles Stake which awards suffix titles, over the AKC Singles Stake which does not. Some felt that AKC is only in it for the money and is down on mixed breeds. Interestingly, some felt that a merger would result in more opportunities to course, and some felt it would result in fewer opportunities to course. Overall, these comments and opinions were very thoughtful and raised important issues.

Next Steps

ASFA fully intends to maintain its identity and continue to work on improving the sport for exhibitors and their dogs. ASFA anticipates scheduling a few Town Hall meetings via Zoom in the near future to further discuss these issues with fancy.



A New Historical Novel Of the World of Greyhound Racing

Author Charles Blanning has “put the band back together” with his new novel *Electric Rabbit*, the sequel to his first novel, *Rags To Riches*. Like Mr. Blanning’s first work of fiction, *Electric Rabbit* is fast-moving historical fiction which weaves almost all the cast of fictional characters that we loved or loathed from *Rags* into the fascinating true story of how Greyhound racing was brought from its birthplace in America to England.

Electric Rabbit begins in 1925 England, four years after the exciting conclusion of *Rags to Riches*. Captain Jack Howard has set up a horse training yard with his sidekick Arthur Cobb and is planning a return to steeplechasing of his now-famous Thoroughbred Flying Home. Samantha Gore-House has returned to Ireland with her coursing Greyhound Rags after being reunited with her war-wounded brother Hugh. She is helping neighbor Mr. O’Sullivan with his horses and contemplating a breeding of Rags to an Irish coursing Greyhound named Glorious Event. Glamorous actress Daisy Taylor, aka Lady Rippers, has returned to the stage in London, still uncertain as to whether her crooked husband, Sir Buckland Rippers, really drowned in the English Channel.


Meanwhile in America, a real historical figure, wealthy socialite Charles Alexander Munn II is at his home in Palm Beach, Florida (one of his several homes around the world) and is taken by a friend to see

a new sport, Greyhound racing, at the track in nearby Hialeah. There Munn is introduced to Owen Patrick Smith, the inventor of the first successful artificial lure and the “father” of Greyhound racing. Though Charlie Munn could easily live out his life on his family’s accumulated wealth without lifting a finger, he is a sportsman and entrepreneur at heart and is always on the lookout for interesting ways to invest his money. Munn and O.P. Smith reach a “handshake” agreement whereby Smith will provide Munn his lure technology as well as one of his equipment engineers to see if Munn can get Greyhound racing started in England.


In England during a months-long stay in Europe, Munn is introduced to Major Leslie Lyne Dixon, a veterinarian and avid coursing man. He shows Major Dixon photographs and even a film of Greyhound racing in America, and Dixon immediately sees both the sporting and profit potential for Greyhound racing in England. They reach a gentleman’s agreement whereby Munn will recruit investors and Dixon will use his contacts in the coursing fraternity to get the Greyhounds required for the first track. Neither is successful in their first quests: Munn’s wealthy English friends believe Greyhound racing is too speculative, while the “Lords and Sirs” who own the big coursing Greyhound kennels won’t lend any of their dogs for such a plebian pursuit. In reporting the results of their efforts to each other, Munn says, “Not a bob (shilling),” while Dixon says, “Not a dog.”

Their fortunes change, however, when Charlie Munn and his wife spend time at the country estate of one of Mrs. Munn’s Astor cousins, who had married a member of the Bass brewing family. There Munn meets a fellow houseguest, General Alfred Critchley, who had been the youngest general in the British army during World War I. Critchley had used his military logistics skills to make a postwar fortune in creating the Portland Cement Company. Though the General was a foxhunter rather than a courser, he could recognize a profitable sporting-and-wagering opportunity when he saw one.

With Critchley's and Munn's money, and with the coursing Greyhounds that Dixon had by now managed to entice the more working-class breeders and trainers to give a go at the new sport, a new company called the Greyhound Racing Association was formed. The new enterprise was literally "off to the races" with the opening in July 1926 of Belle Vue in Manchester, the first track in England, with General Critchley at the helm.



Although Critchley knew full well that the biggest draw for Greyhound racing was the wagering opportunities, paradoxically he was remarkably *laissez-faire* about regulating the bookmakers who set up their pitches to take bets at his tracks. This provided an opening for all manner of "shenanigans and skullduggery" often associated with unregulated gambling, from fraudsters to bookmaker "protection" rackets. Author Blanning makes full use of this historical fact to weave various plotlines into which he can insert the more dodgy of his fictional characters, keeping the reader intrigued as to what they will cook up next in trying to take advantage of General Critchley's disinterest in the bookmakers at his tracks.

Mr. Blanning artfully uses the dialogue between various of both the fictional and historical characters to provide the reader with all manner of information on Greyhounds, hares, horses and country sports. We learn the finer points of properly rearing Greyhound puppies, capturing and caring for hares used in park coursing, and teaching coursing Greyhounds how to become racing Greyhounds.

In an interview on the podcast ***Greyhound Nation*** (www.greyhoundnation.dog), the author explained that he included those passages not only for reader interest but also to leave a historical record of these practices for a future time when those who actually carried them out are long gone. Mr. Blanning is a Greyhound historian at heart, and teaching a bit of Greyhound history in each of his books is part of his literary mission.

All in all, ***Electric Rabbit*** is very much as entertaining and informative as ***Rags to Riches***. It provides a highly readable look at the sporting culture of 1920s England, from coursing and horse racing to boxing and Greyhound racing. The reader becomes invested in how events play out for both the enduring (and mostly very likable) fictional characters and the actual historical characters. As with most good novels, as the final chapter closes, the reader is left very much wanting the story to continue in another sequel. Here's hoping that Mr. Blanning, who is the most prolific author in the history of the Greyhound breed, will favor us with a third Greyhound novel !

Those without access to Facebook may send an e-mail to Mr. Blanning at charles.blanning@btinternet.com The cost of the book to the U.S. is 15 British pounds plus 10 pounds shipping – the currency conversion is easy if you pay via Paypal or credit card, and translates to about \$32 U.S. total. The author will sign the book and include a dedication of your choosing at no additional cost.

If you have not previously read ***Rags to Riches***, Mr. Blanning is offering a "twin pack" of both ***Rags*** and ***Electric Rabbit*** at a cost to the U.S. of 35 pounds including shipping, or about \$45 U.S., a savings of about \$19 over purchasing each book separately. As with most fiction series, reading the first novel will definitely enhance your enjoyment of the sequel. Both books are printed in relatively small runs and usually sell out quickly, so readers wanting one or both books are well advised to order them sooner rather than later. – *John Parker*

Notes from Judges Licensing:

There is an error in Chapter XI, Section 5a which is being addressed by the Judges Committee. Following is what should have been in the last change of this section:

.... The provisional license encompasses all breeds, but at no time shall a person judge more than four breeds in addition to Singles stake and Provisional breed stake, for which he is not regularly licensed at any one trial without special dispensation from the ASFA ~~Judges Chair~~ **Regional Director**. In each planned case where a provisional judge is to judge more than four breeds provisionally at one trial, the respective Regional Director must write a letter of approval to the Scheduling Chair in advance of, or together with, the sample premium list. There will be no exception without such written dispensation. This provision applies to both Regional Invitationals and to standard trials.

INTERFERENCE

"Articles from the Archives"
by Lyle Gillette

What is "interference"?

Webster's Collegiate Dictionary says, "to collide; clash." This brief and to-the-point definition will serve us well in judging the coursing hound's performance in a lure field trial.

It is my opinion that there are four main types of interference witnessed on the coursing field which affect the successful running of a course. Our present rules are a sincere effort on the part of the committees to lay down ways to deal with such incidents when they occur, so that our trials can have more meaningful results.

1. We have the unintentional clash or crash of two or more hounds in their eagerness and concentration on the pursuit, forcing a turn in direction and an unavoidable collision. If the hounds that collide immediately take up the pursuit without showing animosity to their coursing mates, the judges should not penalize any of them for interfering. We can say it was an unavoidable accident – caused by the intense concentration of the hounds on their work.
2. We are pestered with the hound that playfully interferes with its coursing mates. This is an *intentional interference* and, in all cases, should be penalized. How severely will depend upon the reaction of any hounds involved.

A good, clean-running hound *can* be literally ruined for running in trials by such a "playful one." Usually there are one or both of the following results brought about by the "playful" experience on the coursing field. Some hounds, after being molested by the "player," will be reluctant to take the lead in a course, but will hedge and lay back, not really concentrating on the lure, watching with one eye for another "playful one" to come barging up.

Other hounds will resent the playful interference, lash out at the provoker and keep on with the pursuit of the lure. Such hounds are too often disqualified for allegedly being involved in a vicious attack, when nothing more than a protest has been made by the hound being

annoyed. However, if the response is more than a signal of protest - that is, if the molested hound turns and attacks, breaking for a spell his pursuit of the lure and becoming involved in a hassle – then he must be penalized, either dismissed or disqualified depending upon whether a real act of aggression or viciousness has been committed.

The necessity of making decisions on this type of interference makes it mandatory that our judges be experienced dog-handling people, or persons who seriously try to understand the temperament of the running hound, what kind of temperament is acceptable and what type is not.

Without this type of person doing the judging, our trials' biggest mistakes are going to be made in reaching *just* decisions. Our rules can be better, and will be made more explicit as experience reveals the road for us; but the rules adopted in 1977 *are our rules until May 1, 1978*, and we must make the best of them. The better we understand the coursing hounds and their work, the better will be our decisions, and so will be the future rules upon which we decide.

3. Outright aggression is the third type of interference – a vicious display of an aggressive desire to fight one or more hounds in a course, losing all concentration toward the lure. Such animals should be *immediately disqualified*. Owners of such hounds should not re-enter them in any licensed trial until they set out on a serious effort to rehabilitate these hounds and cure their affliction, according to the rules and a sportsmanlike attitude.

A coursing hound's disposition is *not* a temperament which allows it to fight its coursing mate. Hounds that persistently display this trait are deviating from the standard as much as one without teeth!

4. The bumper or crowder does not come along often, but occasionally we see one who deliberately crowds or bumps his coursing mate. This hound's habit usually does not last long. He either gets thrown for a loop or becomes involved in a hassle that leads directly to disqualification. But, because the crowder doesn't last long as a crowder does not mean that we should close our eyes to it. Dismiss them, and, of course the owners will know why. They *can break their dogs of the habit or, sure enough, a hassle and disqualification are just around the corner.*

There have been occasions where judges have disqualified hounds for cause, and have thereupon suffered abuse, insults and curses by the owners of the disqualified hound. We should all remember that behavior of this

type can disqualify the owner also, with the result that such persons are thereafter unable to enter any other hound he or she may own.

Most people who course *do* abide by the decision made by various officials on the field and avoid displaying their disappointments. A hound that gets dismissed or disqualified is not condemned to death but has been placed in a position where it cannot do harm, either grave or minute, to other hounds.

Coursing is providing us with the means to test *the temperament* of our hounds. In return, we should heed the warnings and decisions not only to improve an individual hounds, but to base our program of breeding on those hounds whose dispositions are as near faultless as can be. This is a side-effect of coursing, which, if used correctly, can hasten the elimination of any incompatibility in the coursing hounds. Let all of us – judges and participants alike – be constructive and objective about the interferer; judge it fairly and, if necessary, penalize the dog on the basis of performance in line with the rules.

How to Submit Your Trial Results Electronically to Qualify for the Per Capita Discount

NOTE: If the following format is not met, the club will be directed to pay the full per capita.

Each trial day is to be submitted in the following order.

It is similar to how you would submit the results via snail mail **ONLY** it is to be scanned or copied into **one continuous document for each day** and the entries that need to be submitted should follow the appropriate record sheet. Lastly, it must be received within 1 week of the trial(s). (Note: If there is a trial on Saturday and Sunday, that is two trials, thus two files).

- A completed copy of the FTS Report completed in entirety. Available on the ASFA Website at: [Rec 25-FIELD TRIAL SECRETARY REPORT \(3\).pdf \(asfa.org\)](#).
- Per capita sheet for each day. If you are paying the fee by PayPal send it to treasurer@asfa.org. Put the PayPal transaction ID on the allotted space. Otherwise, the check should be submitted to me within a week of the trial. If you have had LCI entries that have requested an LCI number, be sure to include the \$10.00 fee for each request and make note of it on per capita sheet.
- An updated copy of the premium list is required only if there were any changes to the course plan or to the judge's panel from what was posted on the ASFA website. For changes to the judge's panel the Chair of Judge's must be notified of change and reason. Although it is not required to include a copy of premium it is appreciated.

- **Record sheets are to be in alphabetical order - by breed.** If there are any entry forms that must be submitted (see below), they are to be scanned or copied behind the record sheet on which they are listed. This continues for all of the breeds that were entered.

All record sheets completed in entirety that includes the BIF sheet with the registration numbers. All information needs to be legible and accurate.

- If any trial entry is Excused, Dismissed or Disqualified, a copy of the judge's sheet(s) is to be included with the results. They are to be scanned and placed with the entry(s) behind the appropriate Record Sheet.
- When two judges are used, they shall be designated on the record sheet as Judge 1 and Judge 2, alphabetically by last name. This is for all judges whether Provisional or full judge. ASFA OPERATIONAL POLICY O-TRIALS15.
- The Field Clerk's name shall be indicated on each record sheet, but the Field Clerk's signature is not required. Even if the FTS is the clerk there needs to be a name on the clerk line. ASFA OPERATIONAL POLICY O-TRIALS04.
- Per ASFA Running Rules, Ch V Sec 6 (g), hounds can no longer be left tied. There must be a runoff or a forfeit. The only tie that can stand is if it is the result of an error found during post-trial review by the FTS and then a note must be attached explaining the problem.
- Any hound that is listed, but did not run, will need to have an acceptable reason listed on the record sheet (per the ASFA Running Rules). If nothing is noted or if it just says "pulled", the hound will count for per capita purposes. If an owner is unable to separate their hounds and decides to pull an entry, there is no refund for this!

- On the Singles Record Sheet, I would like the breed initials placed in the section with the call name. It is helpful to me if I have questions and am trying to search the database.
- **Entries that must be submitted with your trial results**
 - Entries for all hound(s) that are marked as FTE (First Time Entry). This must be accompanied by proof of registration (examples AKC, UKC or CKC), waived for NGA registered hounds & proof of certification (signed certification is only good for one year) if entered in a regular stake. If proof of certification has been waived, a copy of the signed waiver and proof of the title must be included. Any FTE in the Single Stake and the LCI Stakes require a copy of registration, unless the LCI is requesting registration with ASFA. Then the form to request an ASFA registration number must be attached.
 - Entry forms that indicate a change in information (titles, address, etc.).
 - If the change is in ownership, an updated copy of registration that reflects that change must be attached.
 - Entry forms for hounds that reflect that a hound is working off a dismissal.

Most Frequent Records Errors

1. FTE entries not submitted,
This is typically because the owner has not marked the entry as such. Since I no longer receive all of the entries I frequently come across entries on the record sheet that is a FTE but I don't have the entry. I will email you for the entry, as I need it ASAP so as not to delay trial entry.
2. Incomplete Records sheets.
All Record sheets must have call name & registration number.

3. Not marking forfeits, just marking the placement(s).
4. The name of the field clerk is missing
(Required to be listed on the Record sheet).
5. Giving hounds placements that have not received a total 50% of possible combined score.
(One judge = at least 50 points. Two judges = 100 points).
6. Per capita difference between amount submitted and my count. With the use of per capita break down I am able to figure out where the error might be and whether it is you (hounds that are absent or pulled without valid reason not counted is a big reason) or me. If it is you, I will email you for the corrected per capita to be paid.
